Notable Incidents

Multiple reports of theft of motor vehicle parts (catalytic converters) were reported at Central Regional Hospital. Subjects were cutting the catalytic converters off of state-owned vans. As a result of a criminal investigation, Sgt. Ruby was able to identify the vehicle used and also identify one of the two suspects. The vehicle used in previous thefts was observed by PSO Carver and after a traffic stop, it resulted in the arrest of Curtis Lovelady and Chestin Wilson. Mr. Lovelady had multiple felony warrants for the theft of catalytic converters from Durham when he was arrested by PSO Carver. Both subjects were charged with the previous thefts from state owned vans. They were issued a \$100,000 bond.

Chief's Notes

On 6/25/2021 Butner Public Safety hosted a multiagency DWI checkpoint on NC Hwy 56. The Granville County Sheriff's Office, Creedmoor Police Dept. Stem Police Dept., NC Highway Patrol and the BAT mobile from the NC Forensic Tests for Alcohol participated in the event. A total of 22 citations were issued during the four-hour event.
