Notable Events

On July 9th, a breaking and entering was reported at AMT group on East Lyon Station Rd. A burglar alarm came into Butner Public Safety Communications at 658 AM. Responding officers found a garage/bay style door bent away from its tracks where it appeared entry was made into the building. A portable generator was found in the roadway just outside of the business which appeared to have fallen off the suspect's vehicle as they drove away. Investigative Lt. Williams investigated the burglary and quickly established leads. Mr. Dale Emory of Creedmoor was arrested and charged with Breaking and Entering, Larceny, Possession of Stolen Goods, and injury to real property. Mr. Emory was given a \$20,000 Secured bond. After serving a search warrant on Mr. Emory's residence, other stolen property was located and tied to other thefts by Mr. Emory.

Chief's Notes

Training hours overview- From June 26-July 24, Butner Public Safety employees participated in 404 hours of fire training and 184 hours of law enforcement training. This includes all training that is attended by Public Safety Officers, Firefighters, Telecommunicators, and civilian personnel.

The Fireworks event went well. During the event, a heavy down pour of rain occurred which caused numerous vehicles to become stuck. Three Butner Public Safety officers went out and assisted in pushing cars out of the mud while getting covered in mud themselves. During the rain, BPS had a report of a missing 9-year-old. The parents advised that the child ran once the rain started and she could not be located. BPS officers were able to find the child under the stage area.

Butner Public Safety received a grant from Mars Petcare which is part of Mars Incorporated for dog food for K9 Lando for a year. Each year we are eligible to receive the grant and when the new K9 is put into service we will be able to get food for that dog also.
