Food Truck Update

The Town of Butner is excited to announce that we have updated regulations on food trucks. Food trucks are now allowed outside of Town sponsored events on commercial properties with a permit. Food trucks are allowed 12 temporary use permits per lot in



a calendar year. Food trucks will need applicable permits from Granville-Vance Public Health and any other required approvals. Food trucks may only operate between the hours of 6:00 a.m. to midnight and must be removed from all permitted locations during the hours when they are not permitted to be in operation, and may not be stored, parked, or left overnight on any public street or sidewalk. Food truck operators can contact the Butner Planning Department at planning@butnernc.org for more information and to obtain a permit.

Road Concerns

Encountered a pesky pothole or navigated through a waterlogged section on your daily drive? We understand the importance of smooth and safe road conditions, and we want to hear from you! In Butner, various roads fall under different jurisdictions. State-owned roads include C Street, D Street, G Street, Central Avenue, Gate 2 Road, Lyon Station Road, and Will Suitt Road. Meanwhile, the Town oversees roads like E Street, F Street, and numbered streets such as 13th, 14th, and beyond. Gun Cable Locks

Gun cable locks are devices designed to enhance firearm safety by preventing unauthorized access and use. These locks typically consist of a strong cable that is threaded through the gun's action or the barrel, rendering the firearm inoperable. They often come with a padlock or combination lock to secure the cable in place.

The primary purpose of gun cable locks is to promote responsible gun ownership and prevent accidental or unauthorized use, especially in households with children or individuals who shouldn't have access to firearms. It's essential for gun owners to store their firearms securely to reduce the risk of accidents, theft, or misuse.

North Carolina General Statute 14-315.1 states that any person who resides in the same premises as a minor, owns or possesses a firearm, and stores or leaves the firearm (i) in a condition that the firearm can be discharged and (ii) in a manner that the person knew or should have known that an unsupervised minor would be able to gain access to the firearm, is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor if a minor gains access to the firearm without the lawful permission of the minor's parents or a person having charge of the minor and the minor: (1) Possesses it on school property, exhibits it in a public place in a careless, angry, or threatening manner; causes personal injury or death with it not in self defense; or uses it in the commission of a

Butner Public Safety has received a grant from Project Child Safe for safety kits. Each kit contains a cable-style gun locking device and a safety brochure. The firearm safety brochure that is included with the gun lock is just as important as the lock itself. A key goal of the program is to prevent a loaded firearm from being left lying around the house where a child could pick it up and play with it. That's a tragedy waiting to happen. If you would like to obtain a free safety kit, come to Butner Public Safety and request a kit. Firearm owners who request a kit will receive a free safety kit with "no questions asked."

Littering

Littering is impacting the beauty of the environment around us. Winter can indeed reveal the extent of litter along roadways when the leaves fall and the grass dies. In North Carolina, citizens can be cited for littering, and they could also be cited with failure to secure loads for those that allow their litter and debris to fall from their vehicles even if they did not intentionally litter. Littering more than 500 pounds is a felony in North Carolina. Reporting such incidents to local authorities can help address the issue and promote a cleaner and more appealing environment. If someone has littered on your property within Butner Town Limits, please contact Butner Public Safety at 919-575-6561. BPS officers will then try and determine who was the owner of the trash and take enforcement action. Everyone plays a role in maintaining a clean and aesthetically pleasing community.

HEALTH BEAT

Many adults experience anxiety in their daily lives, whether at work or at home. The stresses of life can manifest themselves in various ways, such as agitation, anger, fear, and frustration. Teenagers, in particular, are vulnerable due to their lack of life experience in coping with these emotions. Signs of anxiety may include, but are not limited to:

- Sudden episodes of intense fear
- Constant worry about potential events
- Extreme fear of specific objects or places
- · Difficulty sleeping or concentrating
- · Dizziness and shaking
- Sweating

As teenagers grow older, anxieties can intensify. If left undiagnosed, these anxieties may negatively impact school involvement, academic performance, and relationships with family and others.
