Butner has a unique opportunity to develop a town center that will be a place we can walk to, show off to guests, meet



your neighbors, shop, eat, drink, live, work, and enjoy! Staff is working on the rules that will guide Town efforts for the Town Center in coming years. Specifically as these relate to the Umstead Correctional Site and how

we make Butner's "Main Street", Central Avenue, a destination that reflects the Town's aspirations, serves a diverse population of residents, workers, and visitors utilizing sound design principles.

East End Connector Updates



NCDOT is very close to opening the East End Connector project. Demolition of an old railroad bridge is near completion. This new connection between I-85 and RTP will reduce travel times for Butner residents dramatically and is scheduled to open at the end of May.

BUTNER BEAUTIFICATION

The Town of Butner's Beautification Committee has been working with Town Staff on planning ways to improve the Town's appearance and first impression of visitors. An award from WRAL helped the Town start improvements to the entrance of Town from I-85 with an award of azaleas.

LDO Updates

On April 7, Town Council approved an update that will allow for "floating" zoning districts along Gate 1 and Gate 2 Roads. This does not change any current zoning regulations in these areas, but applicants can apply for a rezoning that will enable them to develop according to these new standards. HEALTH BEAT



The pandemic has changed our lives in ways we never thought possible. One of the outcomes that has resulted from this health crisis is teleworking, and how it allows people to work from home, but also allows a positive balance between work, our health, and well-being. In the last year, the U.S. population was surveyed to find out how teleworking has benefited a person's health, and well-being. The results were:

- 64% of all respondents were satisfied with virtual work
- 67% reporting it helped to improve the quality of work
- 61% reporting that it improved their productivity
- 36% would like to continue teleworking after the pandemic
- 49% felt that they were able to balance personal and work life

Teleworking is here to stay! People have found recaptured time with their family, improved quality of health, and life, and are more productive. The even greater impact is reduction of carbon emission due to reduced vehicle traffic.

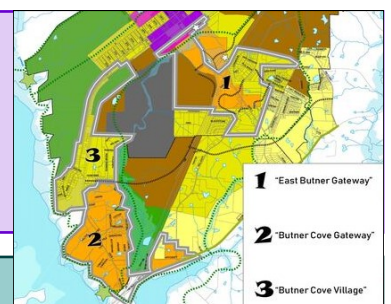

Butner Planning Department issued 34 permits in the first quarter of 2022 valued at \$5,241,600.

Open year-round **Lake Holt** allows for all sorts of recreation opportunities. There are picnic shelters available for rent, a playground, and the Lakeside Grill. Boat launches are only \$3 daily, \$25 monthly, or \$150 for a year. Fishermen are allowed to keep up to 10 bass per day with only two being greater than 14 inches. One of the most common code enforcement violations each year is grass. The Butner Municipal Ordinance states that grass taller than 12 inches near a residence or commercial building is subject to a notice of violation.



New Business Permits

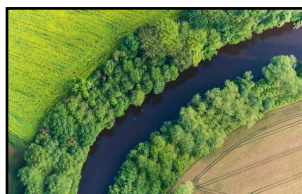
Want to start a new business? Here's some things to keep in mind:

Talk to Planning Staff — Not all businesses are allowed in all parts of Town.

Speak to the Planning Department to see if what you would like to do is feasible in the location you select.

Apply for Permits — Even if there's always been a business in the building you've selected, it will still require zoning review, and a fire inspection.

What Is A Riparian Buffer?

A Riparian Buffer is a strip of vegetation along the banks of a stream. Buffers are commonly 150

feet wide on each side of a stream. Buffers reduce erosion by strengthening stream banks. They filter pollutants such as sediment, phosphorus, and pesticides through the soil before entering the stream. Learn more at nc-cleanwater.com.

The **Butner Chicken Pickin'** festival will be held Saturday, **June 4th from 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.!** It is now in its 28th year and after a two year hiatus due to the pandemic, the **Butner Community Association (BCA)** is so excited about hosting the event this year that they have added some great additions!

There will now be a beer vendor and a wine vendor added to the mix of offerings. And the entertainment line-up is off the chart!

Stage #1 entertainment line-up includes Noah Wall & Tommy Norris of the Barefoot Movement, which is a national award-winning Americana band in which both Noah and Tommy grew up here in Granville County. They will be followed by Melissa's School of Dance. **Stage #2** entertainment line-up includes the Tim Clark Band from Myrtle Beach, SC and the Yates Sisters will perform during the break.

The day's events include: Day-long live entertainment on two stages, BBQ chicken cook-off contest, lots of food and craft vendors, kiddie activities, tractor show, and a fantastic car show that can't be beat!
