# FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

Where did summer go? It is fall already with lots of exciting things happening. Butner Public Safety hosts *National Night Out* on Tuesday, October 1. The first weekend in October brings the *Harvest Show* where one can experience how agriculture built Granville County. The annual *Community Campfire* will be held on Saturday, November 2 at Lake Holt. Come make s'mores and catch an outdoor showing of "SmallFoot." December kicks off with our annual holiday events: *Pictures with Santa* and *Christmas in the Park* on December 6, and the *Christmas Parade* on December 7.

The State approved the transfer of 36 acres to the Town, formerly the Umstead Correctional Center, and we are in the process of assessing its potential. We want to avoid hasty decisions in order to get the right fit. Thank you to those who have already shared your ideas for this property. Renovation for our new training center should be completed mid-October. Rice Wrap Food Corporation, located in the Falls Lake Commerce Center, is hiring and will go into full operation soon. Construction is progressing on the Veterans Life Center (VLC), a facility which will enable at-risk veterans to re-enter society. On the topic of veterans, the annual Veterans Day Ceremony will be November 11 at 11:00 AM at the Soldiers Memorial Sports Arena. This year's keynote speaker will be Colonel Douglas Phillips, a career soldier with seven combat deployments.

Also, this is an election year. We have 3 candidates for Town Council and 2 Mayoral candidates on the ballot this year for Butner. Please go out and vote for the candidates of your choice. Do it for yourself, but also do it for the countless men and women who fought and sacrificed so much so you can.

# **BUTNER PUBLIC SAFETY TRAINING CENTER**

**Old Fire Station Renovation Project** 



Over the past few months, you may have noticed the renovation of the *Old Fire Station* on Central Avenue. This fire station was 1 of 5 original stations built during construction of Camp Butner in 1942. Other stations were located at the corners of 12th & G Streets, the 300 block of 11th & C Streets, 24th & C Streets, and 25th & F Streets. In the late 1940's, the other four stations were sold and torn down. The fire

station on Central Avenue remained active until the new public safety building opened in 1984. The Boy Scout Troop used to meet there and firemen worked 24 hour shifts. Also in 1984, shifts went from 24 hours to 12 hours.


Since it was the only original fire station from Camp Butner, it was important to the Town to salvage the structure while modernizing the interior. The Butner Public Safety Training Center will serve as an excellent recruitment tool and training center for the Town. The renovation includes a fitness room, warming kitchen, and an evidence and records storage room.
