

Animal-Vehicle Crashes Soar



The frequency of animal-vehicle crashes climbed considerably in the latest annual report from NCDOT. There was an increase of more than 2,300 crashes in 2019 over the 2018 statewide total.

Roadway Death Rates Decline



Road safety remains a priority for NCDOT and traffic deaths in North Carolina are thankfully still declining.

According to data from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the total number of traffic deaths to our state decreased by 63 or 4.4 percent from 2018 to 2019.
