# TOWN PLANNING

Since late 2020, Town Planning Staff has been working with residents, the Butner Community Association, Planning board, and the Town Council to evaluate and update the Town's future land use map, future goals and objectives. A draft of these documents is available to all residents on at the 2040 Website (butner2040.com)



The focus of the goals and objectives and future land use map is to enhance development standards to create walkable, mixed-use centers, interconnected resi-

dential areas, and high-value natural corridors to encourage a small town vibe. A goal of the future plan is to maximize use of existing infrastructure to enhance fiscal efficiency. The basis of the vision is the Suitability Analysis completed earlier in 2020, pubic surveys, and public workshops. Once complete, the 2040 Plan will be the basis for updating your Town's development and land use standards.

#### Land Development Ordinance Update

The Town of Butner Planning Board has recommended approval for Phases I and II of the LDO update. Phase I is tied to NC General Assembly mandated changes; Phase II is to correct typos and other clerical errors. For additional information, see Butner2040.com, click on LDO Updates.

An off-premises commercial sign is a sign not located on the same parcel as the business, product, or service being advertised. These signs are **PROHIBITED** in the Town of Butner. After numerous complaints the Town of Butner will be enforcing the removal of these signs from its jurisdiction. # HEALTH BEAT



The COVID pandemic has change our lives in ways we never thought possible.

Limiting travel, and movement where we live, and where we work. However, out of this health crisis, teleworking has emerged as a solution to our work life but also obtaining balance between work, our health, and well-being. In the last year, the U.S. population was surveyed to find out how teleworking has benefited a person's health, and well-being. The results were:

- 64% of all respondents were satisfied with virtual work
- 67% reporting it helped to improve the quality of work
- 61% reporting that it improved their productivity
- 36% would like to continue teleworking after the pandemic
- 49% felt that they were able to balance personal and work life
- Teleworking is here to stay. People have found recaptured time with their family, improved quality of health, and life, and are more productive. The even greater impact is reduction of carbon emission due to reduced vehicle traffic.

# BUTNER SAFETY EXCHANGE



A safe exchange zone is where parties who have made arrangements to buy or sell items over social media such as Facebook Marketplace and Craigslist can meet to complete the transaction. This area is also designated for child custody exchanges. The designated areas are under 24-hour video surveillance. If requested, a Butner Public Safety Officer will stand-by during the trans-

action for safety only. Butner Public Safety does not get involved with, enforce, guarantee, or become a party in any way to the transaction of the individuals trading. Butner Public Safety has now designated the public parking area and lobby of Butner Public Safety as a Safety Exchange Zone. Both areas are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

### How does it work?

After agreeing to meet the buyer/seller at Butner Public Safety, park in one of the parking spots in front of the Safe Exchange Zone sign. The transaction can then be conducted on the sidewalk in front of the Safe Exchange Zone sign. If you wish to have an officer stand-by, please call 919-575-6561 ext. 0 and ask the Telecommunicator if you can have an officer stand-by with you at the Safe Exchange Zone. If you would like for the transaction to be conducted indoors, enter through the public entrance and advise the Telecommunicator that you would like to conduct a Safe Exchange transaction in the lobby.
