FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

Summer kicked off with our annual Memorial Day Service, featuring a touching speech by Timothy Payne, a double-amputee veteran. The large crowd heard readings by excellent essay winners, an outstanding band, and experienced the wreath laying ceremony honoring our fallen heroes.

The 24th Annual Chicken Pickin' came next on June 2. It was a fun-filled day with great entertainment, food, games, vendors, and a fantastic car show. A special thanks to the Butner Community Association (BCA) for its efforts in planning, organizing, and executing a superb event.

Upcoming events include the annual fireworks display on July 3 at Lake Holt and Alive After Five (AA5) on August 16 at Gazebo Park.

Many things are happening in Butner. Construction is beginning on new homes on East Lyon Station Road and new businesses continue to open in Town. Town Council approved the budget for this year, maintaining our current tax rate of \$0.3650, which is 2.9 cents over the revenue neutral rate. There should be monies available for needed improvements. Tony Copeland, NC Secretary of Commerce, visited Butner in May and he stressed the importance of having "move-n-ready" sites for developers. We must prepare the Butner Gateway for such development. A BPS substation will be needed in the near future and we must be ready for any unforeseen needs.

STORMWATER & YOU

Almost every weekend, you can find someone washing their car. Often, you see the clues before you see it happening—soapy water flowing down the street.



This water, along with the soap and grime it carries, flows straight into our rivers and creeks. It does **not** get treated first!

Tips for "Greener" Car Washing

- Wash car over grass or gravel
- Use waterless car wash products, or biodegradable soap
- Use a bucket of soapy water to wet your sponge and wring it back into the same bucket
- Pour bucket of soapy water into sink or toilet because this water gets treated
- Avoid using acid-based wheel cleaners
